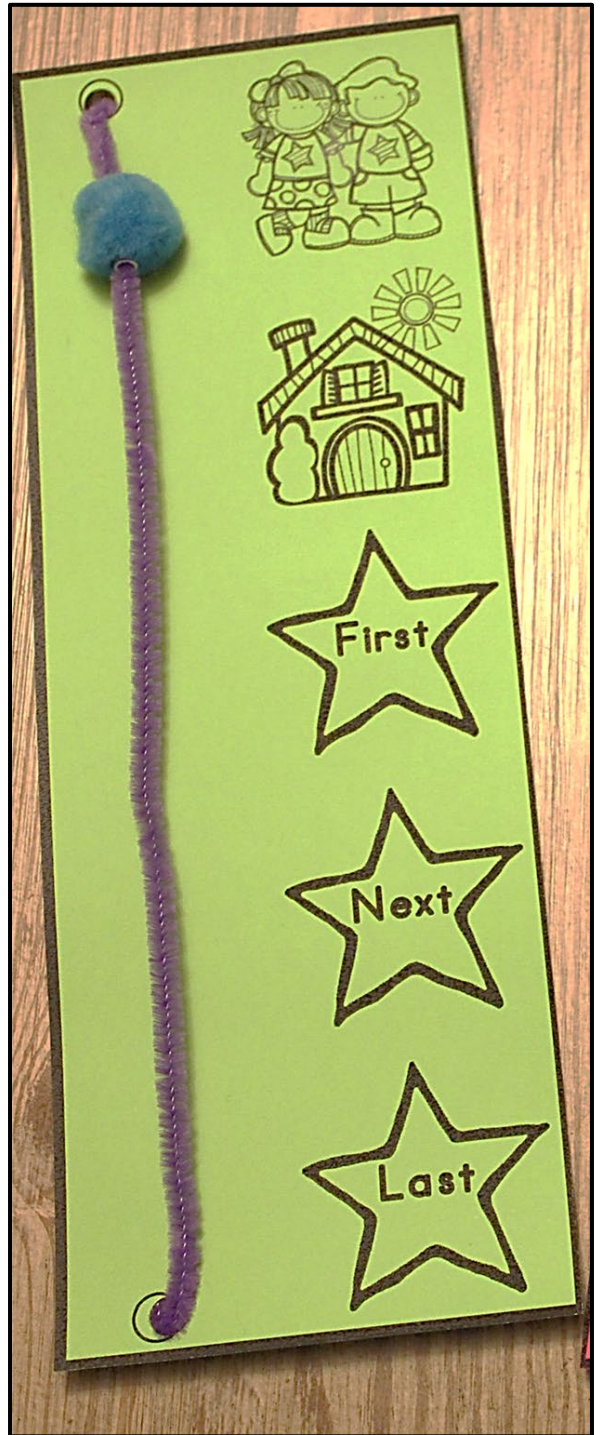

I created this retelling tool because my struggling students were having difficulty remembering to retell the characters, setting, and three events independently. In the past, I used retelling ropes with my kids, but they struggled to remember what each “knot” represented. The retelling slider’s visual cues and symbols help students orally retell the story and/or passage. This highly visual and kinesthetic tool is perfect for retelling instruction!

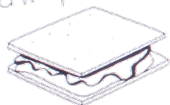
The Playground
