DIRECTIONS FOR USING THIS PACK

In this versatile pack, photographs are used to spark thinking, questioning, analyzing, evaluating, describing, and meaningful writing! Students will also learn through vivid discussions about the photos!

1) Provide students with one of the appropriate writing templates.



*Use the template with blank spaces if your students are not independent writers yet. They can draw and label their thinking! Optional versions contain lines for students to write the name of the object or topic of the photograph.

2) Display a photograph using a projector, document camera, or Smart Board. You can also print out the photograph.



*There are 175 photographs included in this bundle, but you can use ANY photos for this activity! I choose photos based on what we are going to learn later on in the day for pre-exposure. Sometimes I just choose random photographs for fun to get my students thinking, wondering, and writing!

3) Now it's time to "See. Think. Wonder. Write!"



*Students will **write** and describe what they **see** in the photograph, what they **think** about the photograph, and what they are **wondering**. Encourage great observation skills, vivid vocabulary, and curiosity!

4) It's time to TALK about our thinking! Use the fast fact pages!



*Provide students with time to DISCUSS what they wrote on their template pages with one another. Use the fast fact pages to teach your students about the photograph, especially if it is an unknown object or topic to both you and the students. Even if they are familiar with the topic, these facts may be fun to share!

IDEAS FOR USING THIS BUNDLE

Morning Work

Set a tone that says, "Good morning! Get ready to THINK!"

Pre-Exposure

Ignite their observations and curiosity before you teach!

Build & Activate Background Knowledge

Use the activity as a quick assessment to learn what your students already know about a topic or object!

Writing Centers

Create a writing center that ignites critical thinking!

Class Discussions & Oral Language

Let your students TALK to each other before and/or after!

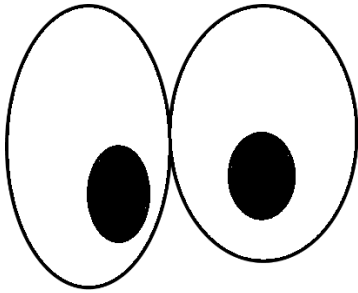
Fast Finishers

Place photographs in a binder for a quick anchor activity!

Warm-Ups

Warm up your students' brains before class or after lunch.

SIMPLE, FAST, AND EFFECTIVE!



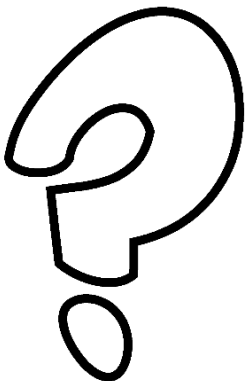
What do you **see**?

Students make observations and write down what they see. This is a great way to let them use and practice vivid vocabulary!



What do you **THiNK**?

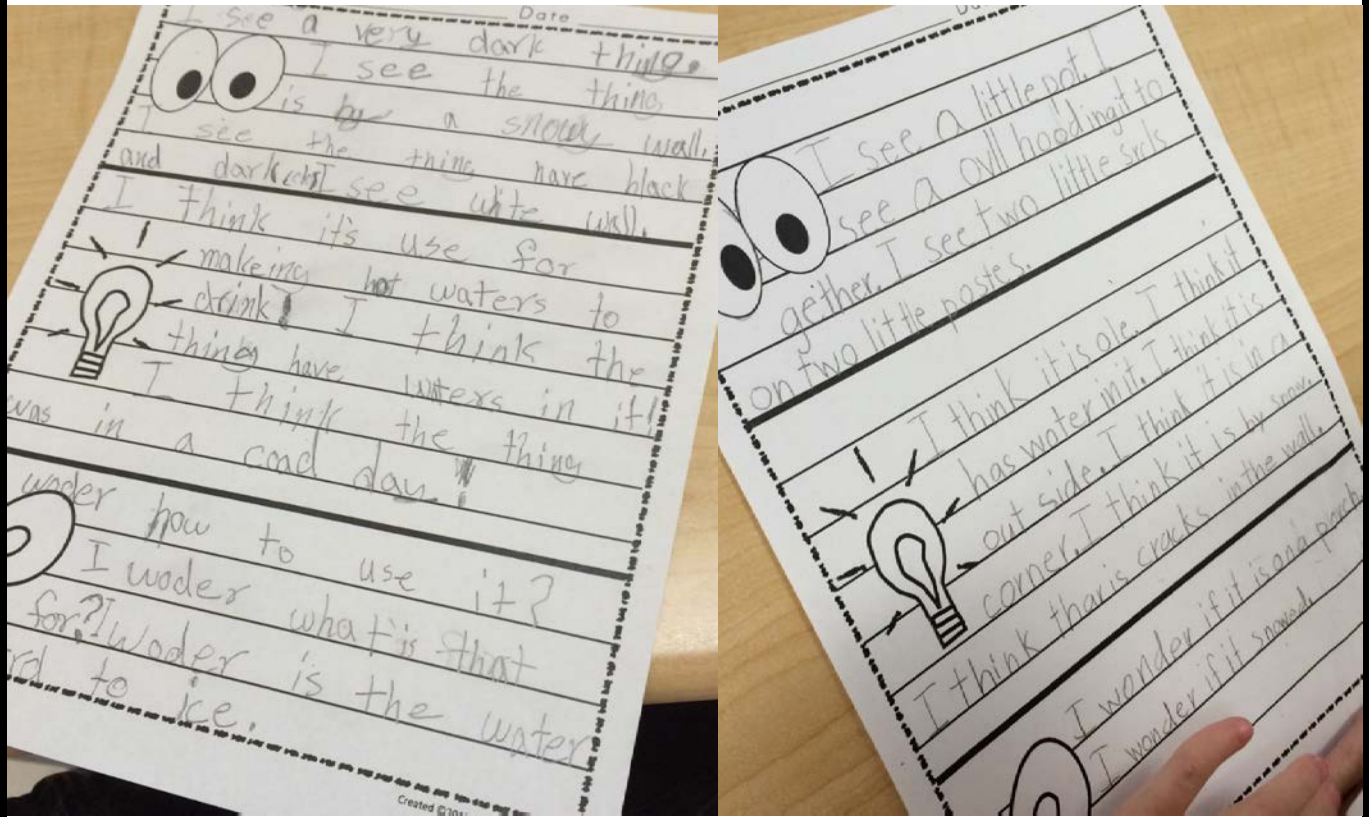
Students jot down thoughts about the photograph. How does it work? What is it used for? What do you know about it already?



What do you **WONDER**?

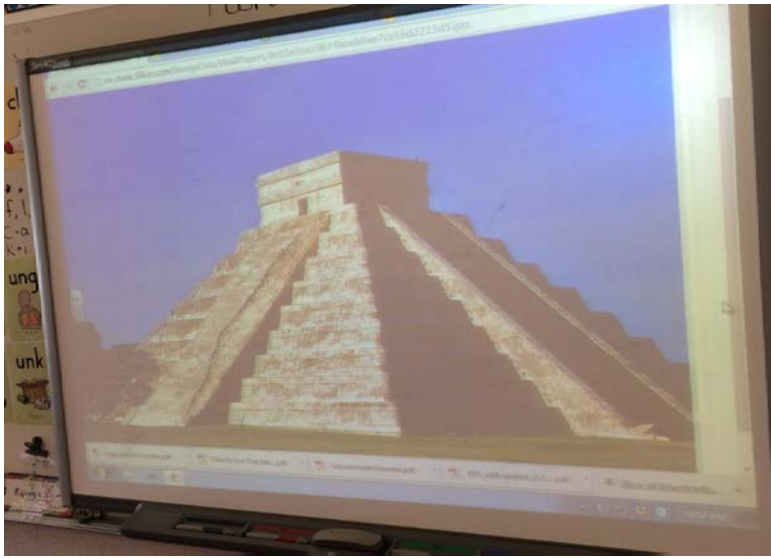
Students ask questions they are wondering about the topic and photograph. This is a great way for students to activate curiosity and critical thinking.

SPARK CRITICAL THINKING



A powerful and effective way to boost critical thinking skills is to provide intentional time for students to observe, evaluate, analyze, and wonder about the world around them!

PRE-EXPPOSE CONTENT!



Pre-exposing students to content before you explicitly teach material can result in quicker and deeper learning.

















Show students a photograph of a topic you are teaching later in the day. Providing time to think, analyze, wonder, and write about it **BEFORE** you teach will get wheels turning!

A volcano is an opening in the earth's surface through which hot gases and lava escape.

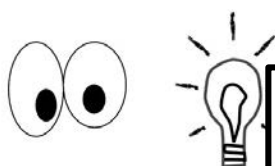
Hot liquid under the earth's surface is called magma. Magma that erupts from a volcano is called lava.

You can eat the skin and flesh of an apple. The flesh of an apple is white and crunchy.

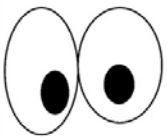
Apples can be eaten fresh or cooked. Apples are also used to make juice and cider.

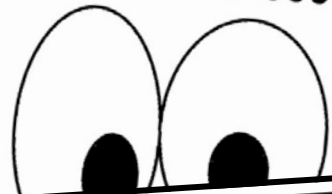

You can use the writing templates with ANY photograph! Use photographs that match what you are currently teaching, what is coming up next, or even what your students are interested in! There are so many possibilities!



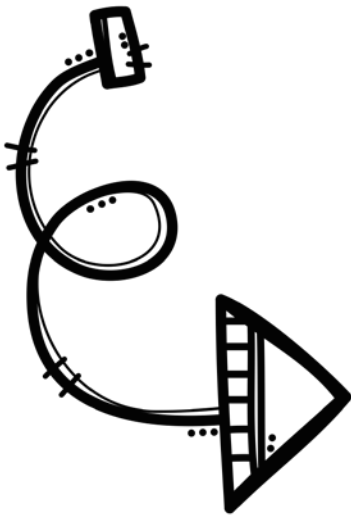


HONEYCOMB

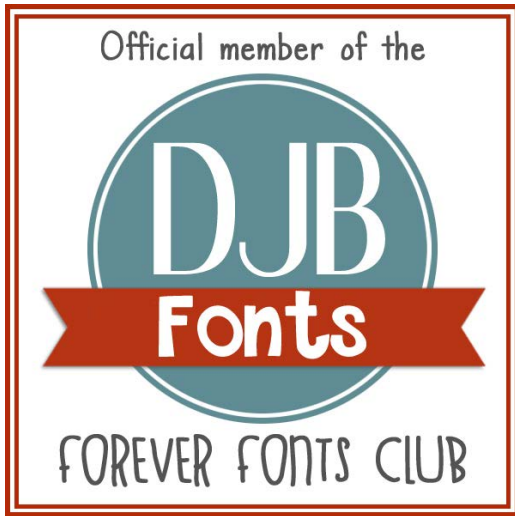
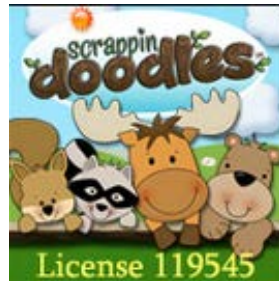
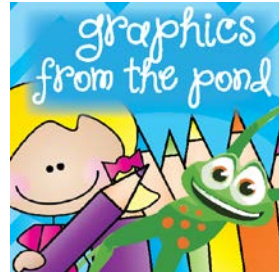
