

ABOUT THIS RESOURCE


Reading cards, posters, and anchor charts that include strategies such as, "check the picture" or "skip the word and move on", only promote quessing and poor reading habits! These strategy cards offer students simple, no-fluff strategy reminders that are based on the Orton-Gillingham method and aligned to the science of reading. These strategy cards do *not* include cutesy characters or fictional names for the strategies. They include a direct, explicit direction for what to do as students decode a word. This approach helps students learn exactly what to do while reading a word. It also helps teachers work on using explicit and direct language during their instruction.



DIFFERENTIATED OPTIONS

Three different sets of the same cards are included.

- an option that would be suited for kindergarten and the beginning of first grade. Each strategy card features a cvc word as the example.
- an option that can be used after students have learned that a grapheme can consist of two or more letters and say one sound (vowel teams, diphthongs, etc.)
- an option that can be used or added on when students learn how to decode multisyllabic words.






