
WHAT MENUS ARE INCLUDED?



READING MENUS

Each monthly reading menu contains a column of activities for Read to Self, Read to Someone, and Respond to Reading. Each month, students will work on letter sounds, sequenced phonics skills, reading stamina, reading enjoyment, partner reading, comprehension skills and strategies, and respond to reading through drawing, labeling, and writing. Work is completed in a notebook or on paper. Students will use books they have at home or books you provide for them.



WRITING MENUS

Each monthly writing menu contains activities that move students along in their independent writing skills and their confidence in writing the sounds they hear in words. Handwriting is a focus in the early months. The Back to School pack focuses solely on handwriting. A word work column is included each month. This column focuses on letter sounds and sequenced phonics skills. At the beginning of the year, students learn how to draw and label their pictures. Sentence stems are used for writing prompts, and as the year continues, prompts in the areas of narrative, informative, opinion, and creative writing are included. Work is completed on paper.










MATH MENUS

Each monthly math menu contains a column for students to count and write numbers up to 100. The middle column, Exploring Numbers, includes activities for concepts like exploring numbers with ten frames, writing numbers, numbers in the teens, place value, comparing numbers, shapes, etc. The third column includes additional skills and concepts such as word problem and story problem activities. These progress in difficulty throughout the year. Work is completed in a notebook or on blank paper with an adult at home.








HANDS-ON LEARNING MENUS

Each monthly hands-on menu contains activities for science, social studies, physical education, music, art, and character education. Each month's science and social studies activities varies and includes a focus on concepts such as force and motion, animal and plant needs, family traditions, economics, rules, maps, states of matter, the sun and the moon, and more! Work is completed in a notebook, on paper, or is often hands-on or through discussion.


